The Jack Palvino Communication/Journalism Hall of Fame and Excellence in Communication Scholarship Premiere Dinner was held Friday, April 4, 2008 in the Cleary Family Auditorium. The event, held in honor of radio personality and Fisher grad Jack Palvino, inducted Ray Sullivan (class of '85), Mike Ginestre (class of '94) and Lisa "Murph" Murphy into the C/J Hall of Fame. Ray Sullivan is the Executive Producer at News 10NBC and helped to create the program for student produced broadcasts of Fisher Football games. Mike Ginestre taught at Fisher from 2000-2007 and guided the PR Club to a full-fledged chapter of PRSSA. Lisa Murphy has over 25 years experience in the print industry, and guided two college newspaper, including the Cardinal Courier to both statewide and national recognition. Each of these inductees were honored for their extensive mentoring of C/J students and involvement in the department programs.

## New Fall Course Offering:

### Introduction to Digital Media

Students will learn technologies and features of Web 2.0, including how to create a wiki, write a blog, and create a podcast. Students will also learn how to navigate Second Life and create Flash movies for use on the web.

In addition, this class focuses on developing a critical understanding of new media and exploring how it can be used for both creative/artistic and professional pursuits. The class will conclude with a public exhibition of student-created digital art (animations, nonlinear storytelling, performance art, etc.).

This course will offered TR 9:30-10:50 by Professor Sarachan, and will count as a P1 credit.
