

DEPT. 199 Core Requirement

For Spring 2009, all Freshmen are required to enroll in a writing class numbered 199C. These classes are offered by: American Studies, Biology, English, History, Honors, Modern Languages, Nursing, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Religious Studies, Sociology, Sports Studies, and Women and Gender Studies. Schedule details for the classes are listed below.

Note: You do not have to take the 199C course in your major; you may take **any** 199C class, **regardless of your major**. (Exception: Political Science majors are required to take POSC 199C.) SOCI 199C is open only to Sociology majors and to students who have not yet declared a major. HNRS 199C sections open only to those non-Honors students who have received prior approval from the Director of the Honors Program.

199C Research-based Writing (3)

Students will learn the basics of writing an academic research paper. Emphasis will be on elements of persuasive argumentation, the inclusion of more than one perspective on an issue, the proper use and documentation of sources, and revision. Students will also learn how to make an effective oral presentation of their research.
