

EXAMPLES OF DIFFERENT LEVELS OF REVIEW

Examples of Exempt Review (has no impact on any other department):

1. Department A plans to revise its curriculum, and it relies on no courses from other departments for its major requirements. Moreover, Department A will not eliminate or re-number any courses that count toward the degree requirements of any other majors.
2. Department A wants to institute new internal pre-requisites for some of its courses, none of which are counted toward the major in any other department.

Examples of Expedited Review (has implications for another department, but does not modify another department):

1. Department A counts courses from Department B for the major in Department A. Those courses were not created in service to Department A, and Department B does not rely on enrollments from students in Department A. Department A decides to no longer use those courses.
2. Department A has courses that are counted by Department B. Department A undergoes a curriculum revision that results in the re-numbering of certain courses, but does not result in the elimination of any courses required by Department B.

Examples of Full Review (modifies another department):

1. Department A decides to eliminate a course counted toward the major in Department B.
2. Students in Department A are required to take a specific course from Department B. Department B decides to implement a new prerequisite for that course.
