College Policy toward Research of Human Subjects

Any course with a research component, and/or faculty involved in research, should review the following statement. This wording should be included in syllabi as appropriate.

Learning about the research process includes learning about the protection of the rights of human subjects (participants). Students in courses which include the collection of data from human subjects must comply with Institutional Review Board policies and procedures which protect the rights of human subjects. This protection includes informed consent, as well as measures to promote the confidentiality of the data which is collected. Students involved with course related data collection should speak with course faculty to learn about Institutional Review Board policies relevant to the course project.
